My research focuses on why and whether people with the same diagnosis experience different participatory barriers (or none) in the close group they identify with, interact with, and invest in. I utilize basic principles from micro-sociology, social psychology, and the sociology of emotions to investigate how barriers arise from behavior, interaction, and emotional relationships.

It is a social fact that social inclusion is based on mutual adjustment on the micro-scale of face-to-face group interaction. My current research explores the inclusion/exclusion of adolescents with hearing loss in school environments. My research forms part of a larger research project "How do we belong together?" (Inge Kryger Pedersen PI, financed by the Velux Foundation). In collaboration with the Danish Centre for Social Scientific Research, we examine why children, young people, and adults with hearing loss often and persistently encounter barriers to social participation and preventive social mechanisms.
